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

Planning a summer wedding is an opportunity to explore and embrace the heart of what the Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges has to offer.



Tips for a Summer Wedding:

1. Visit or ask to see photos of the venue in the season you are planning to get married in. Seasonal conditions may influence how they look and feel.
2. Explore menus that reflect the produce of the season you're getting married in.
3. Spend a weekend with friends in the region and really get a feel for what it's like.
4. Check your venue has shady areas for you and your guests to use for photos and for gathering. What other 'keep cool' features do they offer such as misters, air conditioners, fans, natural cool breezes, waterside locations and even umbrellas can make a world of difference?
5. Grape-draped arbours such as those at Stones/Meletos, grand leafy trees and river locations for photos – there are many spots along the Yarra River – and quality transfers (with air conditioning) such as those offered by [Yarra Valley A2B transfers](#) are essential ingredients for a happy day.



Hot Tip

Pack an extra esky with ice to keep refreshments cool while you're doing your photos. Bouquets and flowers may also benefit from some 'cool time' in the esky in between shots!

Meet the couple

"I will never forget the moment I stepped out from behind the doors, with my dad by my side, and saw Simon's face and all the people gathered there to witness our special moment. Simon had tears in his eyes and my heart melted. It was at that moment it all became real.

Simon Cox and Tash Edward-Johnson have been together since early 2014 and were engaged for 18 months. The couple fell in love on the ski slopes at Mt Buller and haven't looked back, enduring a long distance relationship, starting a new business from scratch, purchasing property, and owner-building a house together. Tash is an Orthotist in a private clinic and hospitals in Melbourne's east. Simon runs Yarra Linen in the Yarra Valley, a laundry and linen service servicing local wineries and function venues.

Who proposed?

It was a Friday night and I was in a hurry to finish my work week and get to our property. When I arrived home he suggested we have glass of wine to relax, and go for a walk in our chestnut orchard. Unbeknown to me he had placed signs up and in front of one, he got down on one knee and proposed. I happily said yes through all the tears.



Is there a story behind your dress and veil?

I fell in love with my dress on my second day of dress shopping. It was hidden behind another gown on the rack. Initially I just saw the lace and was intrigued. It wasn't your standard wedding gown lace and I fell in love. It fitted me like a glove and was everything I wanted. My favourite detail from the day was my veil. It is so special to me. A friend spent hours sewing it with invisible thread. The result was better than I ever imagined. It gave me the train my dress lacked, and made me feel like a princess.

How did you choose your ceremony and reception venue?

We were attending a networking event at Projekt 3488, and as we walked in the doors we turned to each other and said, "this is the one! This is our wedding venue." At this stage we had looked at more than 15 venues and none had felt right. The gardens took our breath away and the venue was restored in an exquisite way that allowed the building to shine in all its charm.

What was your wedding theme?

Simple! A great venue with close friends and family, and amazing food. We wanted a relaxed but formal evening wedding that would be a lasting memory for everyone. Mark from Projekt 3488 has an amazing eye for detail. The styling was all there. The people created the vibe.



Tell us about your bespoke wedding bands

We designed and made our wedding bands with Bec from POD Jewellery (Kyneton) from a strand of white gold and silver. Bec guided us to create wedding bands that will last a lifetime. I had diamonds set into my band for extra sparkle.

What makes your marriage?

To us marriage is a declaration of love built on honesty, faithfulness and respect. It is about going on adventures and getting through the everyday grind together. It's about being a rock for one another when times get tough and celebrating our achievements no matter how big or small. Together we are stronger.

What's your best advice for planning the perfect wedding?

Don't settle, if you find a venue you love and a team of amazing people, your day will go to plan. Don't sweat the small stuff - at the end of the day it will be amazing as long as those close are gathered with you to celebrate. For me, my bride tribe was everything. They made the whole thing fabulous. Stay true to what you want.

What were the highlights?

Mark and Sandi from Projekt 3488 made sure our day went without a hitch and have also become good friends. Rick Liston, our photographer, captured our day perfectly and the photos will be treasured for a lifetime. Jessie from Locavore Catering gave us a menu and food to die for, ensuring all the food came out looking wonderful. Holly from Anouk Flowers came to the rescue and ensured our alter looked stunning. This team made our day seamless, and helped us both be at ease.

When planning an authentic wedding, your choice of celebrant is one of the first and most important decisions you will make.

A traditional wedding is one that reflects a time-honoured ceremony that many people choose for its integrity and customs, but increasingly couples are seeking non-traditional and creative ways of preparing a ceremony that is as individual as you are. A well-chosen celebrant can guide and hold a ceremony that ticks the legal boxes but also personalises a wedding to include your own vows, poetry and epic stories. And the right celebrant will also take the time to get to know you so their contribution is heartfelt and meaningful.

“Standing at the alter” is now a metaphor for the many ways you can say your vows. Archways, floral circles, arbours, special places (including where you first met), cliff tops, forests and other dramatic backdrops, both indoors and outdoors, can all be incorporated into the ceremony, creating unique ‘stages’ that make treasured memories (and fabulous photos). The Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges has some swoony, scene-stealing wedding locations. Have you heard about the Redwood Forest?

Today’s celebrant will take a “Love is Love” approach to your wedding and help you create the perfect ceremony regardless of your denomination, preferences or identity. A “local to the Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges” celebrant will also be a wonderful resource that can connect you to other service providers in the area to work together to keep the spirit and intention of your day aligned and easy.

Choosing the right celebrant, someone you feel comfortable and supported by, is the first step towards your big day being one of joy, connectedness and authenticity. Just add love!

The Perfect Vows:

1. Meet your celebrant and find out if you all resonate. Spend time sharing together to find your common values. It is about the 'feel'. There has to be a real connection for you to be truly moved by your ceremony.
2. Your celebrant will take copious notes and ask leading questions to understand each unique relationship. Your celebrant will be connected to you forever through the marriage process.



3. The legal vows must include each person's full legal name and will precede your personal vows.
4. The personal vows should be relevant to the person to whom they are being said to. Don't just pluck verse off Google, include something personal that will be meaningful to your partner.
5. Look into your partner's eyes and say your vows to them. Don't say them for the benefit of the audience.
6. Keep your personal vows private from each other and only share them on your wedding day. Keep vows to about 250 words or less. Your celebrant will have a copy of each vow to read (or use as a prompt) with her/him on the day.

Now you've got to somehow fit in planning the biggest event of your life, which you only get one shot at, and oh, you've never done anything like it before.

Here's a little secret. You've got this. There are awesome people around every corner who have gone through this many times and who live and breathe weddings in the Yarra Valley.

When you meet with a local supplier, you're not just getting advice on their particular service, you're getting a wealth of knowledge on who they love to work with and why. Your wedding day is so much more than what you can gather from a website, so get out there and start meeting your suppliers in person. You can love my photos, for instance, but the only way for me to get those raw, unguarded moments of pure love is when you feel comfortable being yourselves around me. Grabbing a morning coffee, craft beer, glass of wine or a local gin together is great way of finding who you're going to resonate with on the day.



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You're getting targeted advice by meeting with local suppliers, specific to your wedding. We can make your planning so much easier by recommending other suppliers that are familiar with your venue and the look and feel you're trying to achieve. You can even let us help you choose your venue. I shoot weddings flat-out throughout the year, so I've seen a lot of local venues in a lot of different conditions, in all seasons, plus, I experience the whole wedding from start to finish. I've even taken a couple to my own property, three minutes from their wedding venue for photos in a grassy field overlooking the Yarra Valley and cuddles with a two week old alpaca. You can also provide gin, crème de cassis or Cointreau for cocktail options.
